Louis Litton asked for an extension to clean his property.

Jay is going to put together a small group of volunteers to help with this.

Terri Tucker presented T/N/R Program information through Caring Hands.

Rodger Charles spoke with the state historical society engineers to get them interested in helping with funding for the front porch project.

The front concrete stairs are pushing against the building causing problems with the basement walls and floors. The new stairs will be moved away from the building and cut to reduce the weight making the entire porch the same height.

The inward opening front doors violate current safety codes and the bottom of the front doors have water damage. The Kansas Historical Society would like to see the front doors repaired. They could be made water resistant while removed.

The existing handrail is not original and is close to breaking. The handrail won't be necessary and can be removed once modified.

The bottom step is original and can hopefully be salvaged and incorporated into the new design.

The new front porch will be used to promote find arts and public speaking events. Different community service groups can hold fundraising events. Adding benches will allow more comfortable access to the library wife in the late evening. Total estimated cost of \$100,000.00.

Rodger is asking for a letter of support from the city to submit to the state historical society

**MOTION** by Lindsay to submit a letter of support for the library project, seconded by Rick. Motion carried 5-0.

City Hall is falling down and windows need to be replaced.

Mold testing has been completed at the Police Department. A restoration needs to be contacted to fix the mold issue.
